RN COMPLETION FOR THE LPN PROGRAM

Stark State Information for Interested Applicants

1. LPN's who come to Stark State receive 3 semesters credit of the 5-semester program; they DO have to take an 8-week transition course, and then the last 2 semesters.
2. The application is online—www.starkstate.edu
3. To be accepted to the program, students must take the non-nursing courses that the basic students take the first 2 semesters
 - a. Anatomy and Physiology
 - b. General Psychology
 - c. College Composition
 - d. Intro to Algebra (Unless they test out of this on the College Admission Test—free)
 - e. Intro to Chemistry (Unless graduated from High school in the last 5 years and had chemistry in high school)
 - f. Chemistry I and II
 - g. If on the College Admission Test, their scores indicate a need to take Reading or English remediation—they also have to complete those courses
4. GPA of 2.5 or better (from 12 semester hours of coursework)
5. If someone has taken courses at another college (i.e. University of Akron)—GPA can be used
6. The other requirement is an ACE test that measures Maternity and Pediatric knowledge—since we do not repeat those course and the NCLEX-RN will test these areas.
7. There are information meetings every month. Students will need to come to one to receive information and the application to the nursing courses. Information about the LPN transition and meetings are also on the website, www.starkstate.edu, under Academics, AND Nursing and off to the right side—click on LPN-RN Program.
8. Program at the Career Center is anticipated to begin on or about 3/1/2011. Students will complete the nursing courses in mid-December, less than one year.
9. The class and lab days are projected to be on Tuesday and Wednesday; not sure yet which day clinical will be or where—TBA.
