### **Important dates**

Student/Parent Orientation: Thursday, August 13 from 1 - 6 pm

The first day for first-year students: Tuesday, August 18, 8:05 am to 2:31 pm

**Summer letter:** Keep an eye out for summer mailings: one from Principal Brown with important dates, one from your trade teacher, and one with information about Orientation.

Orientation packets will arrive in July and contain directions about important forms you will need to complete online using FinalForms. *This will be a different account from what you may have used at your home school.* Prioritize completing required forms before the first day. These forms are essential to get started and are required for lab activities. Tech help will be available at Student/Parent Orientation.

**First day supplies:** Pen/pencil and paper.

Checks for Success flyer lists all the things you need to do before the first day, along with other important dates.

**Fees:\*\*** Fees include everything you need to succeed in your program, including books and a laptop. Student fees for the upcoming year will be finalized at the June Career Center board meeting.

*\*\*Important reminder: Be sure to complete the Free and Reduced Lunch Form, so your fees may also be waived. This form is different than the one you've completed for your home school.*

**Uniforms/dress code:** Your trade uniform: \_\_\_\_\_  
For students' safety, all students are required to wear their WCSCC issued ID badge at all times. WCSCC dress code information is available from trade instructors.

Until uniforms are in, students should be in spirit wear. This is apparel representing their home school district, or the 3 E's – enlistment, employment, or enrollment. Students will also receive 4 WCSCC t-shirts on the first day of school to help them be dress code compliant. Things to avoid: shorts, dresses/skirts, sweatpants, and pajama pants. Other dress code options will be in Principal Brown's summer letter. Think about preparing for your career - be professional! Each student will be issued a locker to keep their backpacks and possessions in during the school day. If students want to carry a backpack from class to class, it must be clear or mesh.

**Breakfast and lunch are served daily:** Breakfast is \$2.00 Lunch is \$3.50.

**1:1 laptop program:** Students will receive a laptop (cost included in school fees) for the duration of their term at WCSCC. Students who graduate in good standing will be able to keep their laptop.

**Extra help available at WCSCC:** Tutoring services are available to all students in the extra help area before, during, and after school. IEP accommodations will carry over to WCSCC. Students with IEP accommodations will have a Vocational Special Education Coordinator (VoSE) working with them.

**Academics:** WCSCC offers a range of academic courses, including College Credit Plus (CCP) options, ensuring each student meets or exceeds their graduation requirements.

**Job Placement & Work-Based Learning:** Connects students with real-world experiences and hands-on training. You can jump-start a career and build industry connections while in school with *Job Placement* by meeting attendance and grade requirements and joining the WCSCC Drug Free Club. *Work-Based Learning* offers opportunities for career exploration through job shadowing, field experiences, clinicals, capstone courses, and community service, just to name a few!

**Driver's Education:** WCSCC offers Driver's Education through Myers Driving School. Driver's Ed is a free program offered to juniors starting in Mid-October. Requirements: a valid driver's permit, membership in WCSCC Drug Free Club, and 25 hours of drive time documented with a parent/guardian. Eight hours of behind-the-wheel training typically takes place over four two-hour sessions during student's trade time at WCSCC.

**School calendar:** Students attending the Career Center must follow the Career Center calendar, not their home school district's calendar. Please review our academic schedule for important dates, breaks, and events to ensure attendance aligns with our calendar.

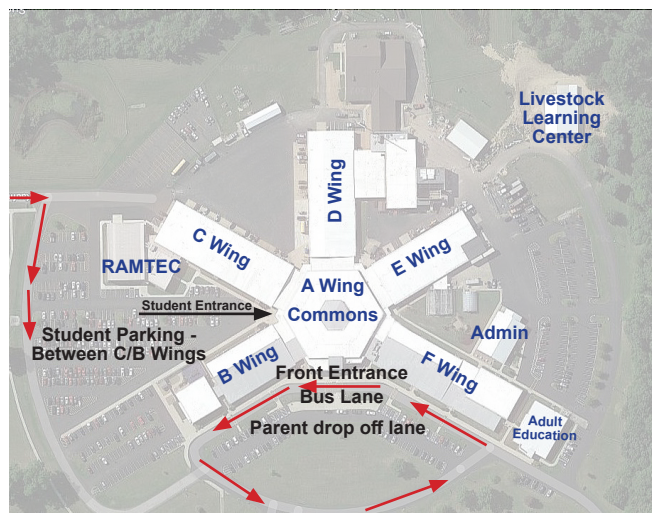
**Snow days and delays:** Cancellation or delays are determined by administration and announced via School Messenger, social media, and Fox 8.

- *Partner school delay:* Students from that school may arrive to WCSCC two-hours late, even if WCSCC does not delay. Students must sign in at the Front Office when they arrive.
- *Partner school cancellation:* Students from that school do not need to attend WCSCC that day. Students will not be counted absent if WCSCC has school and the partner school does not.

**Student activities:** We encourage students to stay involved in their home school activities. Many WCSCC students participate in sports, clubs, band, choir, and drama. Students should talk to their home school counselor about all the ways they can continue to stay involved and informed of what's happening at their home school district. WCSCC also has a large variety of ways for students to get involved and take on leadership roles in clubs and trade-related organizations.

**Parking/student drop off:**

Students who drive will enter via Kaufman Drive, past the Wayne County Federal Credit Union. They must park in the student lot between B/C wings. When dropping off students, please use the designated lane at the front of the building. (See map)
